Fallen Angels Dance Theatre was founded in 2011 by Artistic Director Paul Bayes Kitcher and Creative and Strategic Director Claire Morris.

New Note Orchestra

Brighton based New Note Orchestra uses music and storytelling to help people sustain their recovery from addiction. Providing a safe space for people to be creative, build confidence and develop relationships with people away from drugs and alcohol and helping musicians learn new skills and cognitive dexterity.







Length: 8 minutes



3 dancers
Starts very repetitive
Movement becomes disrupted/stuck

Length: 10 minutes



Movement quality:

An emotional duet starts together and eventually drifts apart.

Slow sustained movements

Angel Wave

Length: 5 minutes

Lighting:

Light source from above Starts quite dark Gets brighter gradually



Music:

Atmospheric sound with a healing energy Only a few musicians playing



Movement quality:

Slow sustained movements travelling across the stage.

The wave washes and gathers the solo dancers.

Then move together as an ensemble of 12

Astrals Journey

Length: 5 minutes

Lighting: Dark and atmospheric Warm yellow lights



Music:
Full orchestra
Theremin - featured instrument
Other worldly sound



Movement quality:
Ensemble of 10.
Start in solo then move together. Dancers connect through duets then gather together in a clump moving as one.

Finale

Length: 10 minutes



Spoken by: John

I was just falling, falling, falling but now finally I have landed.

There was a little spark - A flicker

I started moving
I think that's where it began

6 people from the company will come to the microphone to express their heartfelt gratitude for those that have supported their individual recovery journey.


